ESIT recognizes DHH Specialists and Associates in these roles:

Specialist

- Developmental Specialists: DHH (Teachers of the Deaf)
- Pediatric Audiologists
- Speech Language Pathologists (SLPs) trained in DHH
- Developmental Associates (Paraeducators)

Agencies may assign specific job titles such as
Birth to Three Specialist, Communication Coach,
Early Language Coach, Family Engagement Specialist, etc.

must an ESIT DHH Specialist join the team?

An ESIT Deaf or Hard of Hearing (DHH) Specialist brings helpful expertise and support to the IFSP process, whether the child has been identified as DHH or is still being tested.

ow do I invite an ESIT DHH Specialist to the team?

Ask your Family Resources Coordinator (FRC) about adding an ESIT Developmental Specialist: DHH to your child's IFSP team.

What is Family to Family Support?
